



United States NAVY Salvages 50 Year Old Pump



This Peerless deballasting pump from the floating dry-dock **USS Sustain** sat at the Shore Intermediate Maintenance Facility (SIMA) shop for over a year, awaiting an appropriate and acceptable solution. The estimated cost to cast an exact replacement of this unusual cast steel casing, built in 1944, was in excess of a **quarter million dollars**. A similar, more recent unit, which would have required extensive re-piping, would have cost over \$100,000.
